Dear Electric Aggregation Participant,

This letter is to inform you that the Union Township has decided not to renew the Electric Aggregation program when it expires on your May 2025 meter read date.

The goal for Energy Alliances, the Township's energy consultant, was to find an alternative supplier able to beat Duke Energy Ohio's (Duke) expected default generation supply before the program's expiration. After thorough analysis, Energy Alliances did not find a supplier that could compete with Duke's expected rate starting in June 2025 and suggested to the Township that they not renew the electric aggregation program at this time. In the best interest of the Township and its residents, Energy Alliances recommended that all the accounts on the program go back to Duke's default generation supply rate until such time as a competitive rate can be obtained from an approved supplier(s).

Energy Alliances will continue to watch the market and plans to bring options to the Township if they see a favorable opportunity. The earliest the program would return would be during the summer of 2025.

You do not need to do anything! Energy Harbor, the supplier of the electric aggregation program, will notify Duke that you will return to the default generation supply on your May 2025 meter read date.

As always, you may choose to look for alternative electric suppliers on your own. Be aware that if you enter a contract with an alternative supplier, you WILL NOT receive an opt-out letter IF the electric aggregation is restarted.
