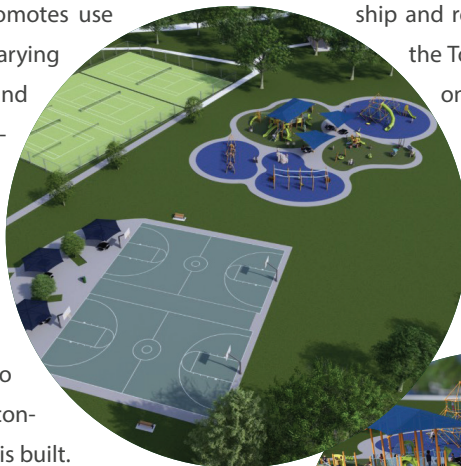
Feedback from our residents and businesses is helpful in the guidance of projects, big or small. A new module is available through CivicPlus,

# Backyard Pool Safety

Backyard pools can provide hours of fun for family and friends. Over the last five years, over 200 pool permits have been approved for Union Township residents. If you are fortunate to be a pool owner, it is important to ensure everyone stays safe in and around water. Below are a few tips for keeping your family safe this summer around the water.

- Make sure a fence is in place surrounding the pool. Please contact the Union Township Planning and Zoning Department for fence guidelines. Utilizing pool covers and adding alarms and sensors provides an extra layer of protection.
- Never leave children alone and always designate at least one adult to stay vigilant and pay attention to the pool.
- Swim lessons are a great way for children and adults to gain comfort and awareness in the water. Beechmont Racquet & Fitness and Mercy Health – West Clermont HealthPlex offer swim lessons in Union Township.
- Prepare for emergencies by taking a CPR certification class. The next training offered by the Union Township Fire Department is on Saturday, July 12, 2025 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Register online at [www.utclermont.gov](http://www.utclermont.gov) or by calling the Fire Department at 513.528.4446.
- Talk to your family and friends about safety rules of your pool such as no horseplay and swim with a buddy.

## Tree/Brush Vouchers

Union Township offers a complimentary tree and brush voucher service to residents. After completing a tree/brush voucher at [www.utclermont.gov](http://www.utclermont.gov) or by visiting the Civic Center or Service Department for a voucher, residents may bring one load of brush per voucher to Bzak Landscaping located at 931 Round Bottom Road. A form of identification to show proof of residency is required. Keep your yard clean of brush with a voucher.





## Local Business Spotlight: Grammas Pizza

Union Township is home to the very first Grammas Pizza, established in 1976. The family-owned restaurant started with four brothers who came to the United States from Greece and has now become a staple in the area. Their brick-oven, flavorful pizzas have brought families and friends together for decades. With fresh-cut vegetables, handmade dough created fresh daily, and their family recipe sauces, Grammas Pizza offers a personalized touch you can't find anywhere else.

Nick Grammas, owner of the Mt. Carmel/Eastgate location in Union Township offers some insight into the popular pizza for your Friday nights, game days, outings, and parties. He loves the process of creating a pizza, from the beginning to the end. He said, "Cooking has always been about family time for me and I love sharing that experience with others."

### How did you get started in creating pizzas?

I was born into the business. My parents had the restaurant before I was born and I'm now the second generation involved. Being a family-owned business, I've been working in the restaurant since I was five years old, folding boxes and cutting buns, onions, and green peppers. My sister and I gradually did more as we got older – like work the oven.

### What about your pizza and offerings distinguishes you from other pizza locations in the region?

Anyone can make a franchise style pizza, but we've always listened

to the patrons that come in and we cater to their different taste buds. We can make them sloppy, add extra cheese, and customize to something you may not have tried but want to explore.

### **Why do people rave about brick oven pizza?**

We consistently look for ways to give back and integrate in our local community. Grammas Pizza fosters community engagement by sponsoring local kids' sports teams, providing pizzas to schools, churches, military, rehabilitation centers, and more.

We are not a traditional franchise restaurant and are one of the few mom and pop places available. Our staff are also an integral part of Grammas Pizza success. Union Township's Fire Department continues to look for ways to better serve our residents and visitors. Community Connect is an effective way to securely share information that will help emergency personnel when responding to your home or business.

Understanding critical information such as designated family meeting spaces, whether you or your family have mobility or other types of functional needs, what type of pets you have, and how to locate occupants, improves the Fire Department's ability to respond during an emergency.

Data that you provide Community Connect is secure and only used for the purpose of better serving you during an emergency.

### **HOW DOES IT WORK?**

- Sign up for an account for free. It just takes your email, phone number and address.
- Enter information that would matter most to assist first responders more effectively during an emergency.
- Update your account over time if any information changes.

### **WHAT INFORMATION CAN I PROVIDE?**

**Property** • Add information about your residence type, any fire sprinklers, and designated meeting places.

**People** • Add emergency contacts, potential hazards, or how to locate occupants.

**Needs** • Add any mobility or other functional needs that may require additional assistance.

**Pets** • Add information about your pet and even add pictures of your pet if you want.

An elderly man was enjoying a meal when a piece of food he was eating became lodged in his throat, obstructing his airway. He was unresponsive. Officer Pangallo immediately began administering the Heimlich maneuver and was able to save the man's life.

## NEW! Businesses Opening Soon

Economic development continues to remain robust in Union Township. We have many exciting businesses opening this summer.

A new Starbucks, a well-known Seattle-based coffeehouse chain, will open in Union Township at 1186 Ohio Pike.

The new Cincinnati Children's Eastgate will expand healthcare services with a 109,800 square-foot medical building including an outpatient surgery center, specialty clinics and an urgent care in Eastgate, located off of Ivy Pointe Boulevard and near Interstate 275. The new medical center is expected to employ approximately 200 people, and the total investment associated with the project is anticipated to be around \$85 million. Cincinnati Children's Eastgate will begin with a soft opening this summer/early fall.



The new Jeff Wyler Used Car Mega Store will be open this summer. This 7,725 square-foot new used car sales center is located on State Route 32, adjacent to Clepper Lane. The new, expanded Jeff Wyler Hyundai and service center is also located on State Route 32, where the previous Mega Store was located. Jeff Wyler has proudly served

the tri-state area for over fifty years and continues to expand and offer services in Union Township. These expansion projects will bring in approximately \$12.5 million in total investment as well as additional jobs at the new Hyundai dealership.



Deeper Roots Massage is a new business to this area and is set to open soon. Deeper Roots Massage will offer relaxation, therapeutic, Reiki, and deep tissue massages as well as yoga and meditation opportunities. Check out this new location at 778 Old State Route 74.

# Citizens Police Academy

The annual Union Township's Citizens Police Academy is a free course offered each fall through the Police Department. The Citizens Police Academy (CPA) is an exciting and educational opportunity to gain insight about the role of the police officer and topics specific to your local law enforcement. Residents get to engage weekly with officers while learning about a new topic each week such as participating in a ride-along with Union Township officers, firing police issued weapons with instructors on a firing range, how detectives investigate crime, and how officers keep themselves safe in today's environment.

The Union Township Citizens Police Academy began in 1998 with a class of 15 residents and was designed to bring residents and citizens who work in the Township together to gain a working knowledge and better understanding of how the Police Department operates. In 2006, CPA was revived and enhanced to include additional learning time and topics geared around the more interesting and

fascinating aspects of law enforcement. Now with over 200 alumni, Union Township residents and police officers are connected through lasting friendships and an opportunity to collaborate together for the betterment of both the Police Department and the community. CPA graduates stay engaged with the community by occasionally helping the Police Department at various community events like Police Night Out and Crime Stoppers Drug Drop Off. The Citizens Police Academy Alumni Association (CPAAA) meets once every other month at the Union Township Civic Center.

The academy is free and will be held on Tuesdays from 6 p.m. until 9 p.m. beginning August 12, 2025 and continue until October 28, 2025. There will be two Saturday classes held from 9 a.m. until noon.

You're invited to apply online for the next course beginning this fall at [www.utclermont.gov](http://www.utclermont.gov) or at the Police Department, located at 4312 Glen Este-Withamsville Road. Applicants must be 21 years of age, possess a current, valid driver's license, and complete a comprehensive background check.
